

EB Garamond (EBGaramond12-Regular.otf 0.016)

This Old-Style Serif font aims to provide a free version of the Garamond types, based on the designs of the Berner specimen from 1592. The fonts make heavy use of OpenType features for specialities like small caps or different number styles as well as for imitating renaissance typography. See the README and Specimen.pdf files in the zip file.

It comes in two sizes, 8pt for sizes up to 10pt, and 12pt for sizes from 10.1pt onwards (used in this document although I specified 10pt - beats me!). It covers all languages with Latin alphabets (with slight reservations about the positions of some of the combining diacriticals in certain African alphabets), and the major European Cyrillic alphabets, as well as both forms of Greek. For the 'Eng' shape in Latin alphabets it uses the N-with-tail form preferred in African languages.

For variations of the Latin and Cyrillic alphabets and for monotonic Greek I attempt to show the whole alphabet, followed by Article 1 of the UDHR (it is traditional!). For other scripts and languages I merely display the digits (if not common 0..9) and Article 1.

This document was prepared using X_YT_EX and fontspec. Depending on the font, missing glyphs will be replaced either by nothing at all (occasional fonts do that), a blank space, an empty box, or some other symbol indicating a missing glyph.

The letter forms used in italic fonts do not always match those used in regular fonts. Here is some English text to cover all letters: a quick brown fox jumped over the lazy dogs A QUICK BROWN FOX JUMPED OVER THE LAZY DOGS.

This font has normal and italic styles, initials fonts, small caps and (12pt) ALLSC (all capitals will be small) variants. The small caps only support some Latin alphabets with patchy coverage for non-European glyphs.ncluding Azeri (I show Turkish instead in the sc file). Similarly, the italic coverage is patchy for non-European Latin alphabets and also incomplete for Ukrainian.

In theory, modern Greek is all monotonic with only an acute accent (*tonos*) and diaeresis (*dialytika*).

Some people continue to use polytonic Greek for cultural reasons.

There are far too many available variants for me to list here — I suspect that some have fallen out of use, but I do not know which. The full range for the small letter alpha includes ἀ (psili), ἁ (dacia), ἂ (psili and varia), ἃ (dasia and varia), ἄ (psili and oxia), ἅ (dasia and oxia), ἆ (psili and perispomeni), ἇ (dasia and perispomeni), Ἰ (varia), Ἱ (oxia), ἰ (psili and ypogegrammeni), ἱ (dasia and ypogegrammeni), ἲ (psili and varia and ypogegrammeni), ἳ (dasia and varia and ypogegrammeni), ἴ (psili and oxia and ypogegrammeni), ἵ (dasia and oxia and ypogegrammeni), ἶ (psili and perispomeni and ypogegrammeni), ἷ (dasia and perispomeni and ypogegrammeni), Ἰ (vrachy), Ἰ̄ (macron), ἰ (varia and ypogegrammeni), ἰ (ypogegrammeni), ἰ (oxia and ypogegrammeni), ἰ̄ (perispomeni), ἰ̄ (perispomeni and ypogegrammeni). There are similar, but smaller, ranges of diacriticals for the other vowels and also for the letter ρ.

4 Other variants of the Latin alphabet

There are many more variations of the Latin alphabet in official use throughout the world. Particularly in african countries, and also for vietnamese, some fonts which are otherwise good may have problems. For some of the african languages it is necessary to use combining diacriticals, e.g. for the uppercase epsilon and open o with diacriticals in Dinka and Lingala — unfortunately, as here, those can sometimes be misplaced.

A tilde can also be used, as here, to mark nasal vowels.

4.4 Pan-Nigerian Alphabet

This alphabet is intended to be sufficient to write all the languages of Nigeria without digraphs. Where the language is tonal, acute, grave and circumflex accents are used to mark High, Low and Falling tones, Mid tone is unmarked. Note that the Wikipedia page for this currently omits N with dot above which is required for the Igbo alphabet at both Wikipedia and Omniglot. In both Igbo and Yoruba, letters with combining dot below can have accents, and the representation can differ according to which of the two combining items is placed first.

Here both è and ẹ have very poor diacriticals.

4.4.3 Yoruba

Gbogbo ènìyàn ni a bí ní òmìnira; iyì àti ẹ̀tọ̀’kọ̀ọ̀kan sì dọ̀gba. Wọ̀n ní ẹ̀bùn ti làákàyè àti ti ẹ̀tí-ọ̀kàn, ó sì yẹ kí wọ̀n ó máa hùwà sí ara wọ̀n gẹ́gẹ́’bí ọ̀mọ̀ iyá.

4.5 Vietnamese

The interesting features of vietnamese are the use of horns on ‘o’ and ‘u’ to provide additional vowels, and the use of diacriticals to show the tone. The letters themselves are pre-composed, but displaying some of the individual tone markings requires combining accents.

5 Quotation-marks, etc.

In real-world usage, particularly when looking at news sites, the presence or absence of the correct quote characters will make a difference. As a coder, I use ‘...’ or “...” but in good text there are variations and this font supports:

left and right single quotes ‘...’	double low 9 and left double quotes „...“
left and right double quotes “...”	guillemets «...»
single turned comma, right single quote ‘...’	angle quotes <...>

In Spanish languages, the inverted exclamation-mark ¡ and inverted question-mark ¿ are necessary.
